

Yorkshire Way

TALK OF THE TOWN



orkshire Day is celebrated every year on August 1, and while the purpose is to promote the historic county of Yorkshire, England, the date of August 1 was also chosen to celebrate it because it dates back to the passing of the British Empire's Slavery Abolition Act 1833 on August 1 in 1834. It was Yorkshire native and British politician William Wilberforce who was the leading English abolitionist, and he lead the parliamentary campaign against the British slave trade for 20 years until the passage of the Slave Trade Act of 1807. Wilberforce was convinced of the importance of religion, morality and education, causes for which he spent his lifetime campaigning on. Wilberforce continued to campaign for the complete abolition of slavery, but had to resign from Parliament in 1826 due to his failing health. His campaigning, however, led to the Slavery Abolition Act 1833, and Wilberforce died just three days after hearing that the passage of the Act through Parliament was assured.

Yorkshire is the largest county in the UK, and today, Yorkshire Day is a celebration that encompasses anything to do with Yorkshire, from cooking and confectionary delights to honoring its history and military customs. To "properly" follow tradition, one must read the Yorkshire Declaration of Integrity. The white rose is the emblem of Yorkshire (dating back to Edmund of Langley, the first Duke of York and founder of the House of York, a dynasty related to the Plantagenet kings), so wearing a white rose with pride is also a tradition affiliated with the day.

Poet of the Month STEVIE SMITH (1902 - 1971) MONDAY, AUGUST 1 10:00 AM

n recognition of Yorkshire Day, our Poet of the month is Yorkshire-born Florence Margaret Smith. Adopting the pen name of Stevie Smith, she was considered a sophisticated if not eccentric poet whose work often covered suffering and mortality. Her most famous poem, "Not Waving But Drowning", and many of her other writings, explored (in the words of *Poetry* contributor David Wright), "the mysterious, rather sinister reality which lurks behind appealing or innocent appearances." Smith was awarded the Cholmondeley Award for Poets in 1966 and the Queen's Gold Medal for Poetry in 1969. She




