

Poet of the Month SYLVIA PLATH (1932 TO 1963)

THURSDAY, 11/03 AT 11:00 AM



Tragic yet brilliant, this American poet, novelist, and short story writer is credited with having advanced the genre of confessional poetry. She is best known for her published collections, *The Colossus and Other Poems* (1960) and *Ariel* (1965), as well as her semi-autobiographical novel published soon before her death in 1963, *The Bell Jar*. Plath was clinically depressed for most of her adult life, and her modern classic, *The Bell Jar* tells the story of a young woman grappling with depression and the desire to take her own life. In the book, the character overcomes her deep melancholy, and concludes with the character seeing the value of continuing her life outweighing that of ending it. Tragically, however, Plath herself was unable to maintain that hopeful approach with regards to her own life.

NOVEMBER IS AVIATION History Month



From Icarus to Leonardo Da Vinci, the fantasy of flight has been the passion of many a dreamer, and it didn't really become a reality until the Wright brothers made the first powered controlled airplane flights in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina. For Icarus, the prideful yet tragic figure of Greek mythology who, in an effort to go beyond human boundaries, flew too close to the sun, melting the wax fastening the wings to his body, sadly plunged to his end in pursuit of this dream. In the 1480s, Da Vinci, who was fascinated with the phenomenon of flight, produced many drawings of flying machines, most of which were impractical. In Paris, France, 1783, the first hot air balloon flight was performed by Jean-Francois Pilatre de Rozier and Francoise Laurent d'Arlandes in a balloon created by the Montgolfier brothers. Ten years later, in 1793, the first hot air balloon flown in the Americas was launched from the Walnut Street Jail in Philadelphia with the French aeronaut Jean Pierre Blanchard as its captain. From the first dreams, to the plans, to the balloons and every device since then that has elevated humans above the earth, Aviation History Month recognizes the achievements of the men and women who have contributed to our ability to fly.


